It is that time to choose your schedule for next school year. I spoke with Mrs. Johansen, your Cambridge counselor, and put together some information to help guide you through selecting your courses. If you have questions or need more information, please don't hesitate to email or call Ms. Johansen directly.

- Once you start taking AICE courses, you must finish your 7 classes within 3 years.
 Example: If you took 1 AICE class in 9th grade then you must finish all 7 classes by 11th grade.
 - If you don't, it is not a big deal, you will just NOT be able to use any AICE classes that fall out of the 3 year time frame.

Use the Cambridge tracking form (on C/O 2020 web page) to help you see what classes are available and what category they fall under. The requirements are: Global Perspectives, 1 class under Math/Science, 1 class under Arts/Humanities and 1 class under Languages. You must take a total of 7 classes to receive the AICE Diploma.

- o Before you can take AICE Biology you must have taken (Pre-AICE Bio & Pre-AICE Chem)
- Before you can take AICE Chemistry you must take (Pre-AICE Chem)
- Before you can take AICE English Language you must take (Pre-AICE English Literature)
- AICE Global Perspectives and AICE English Language can only be taken either 11th or 12th grade year.
 - It is a good idea to take more AICE classes then you need, just to give yourself some wiggle room. Remember you have to pass the exam at the end of the year for each AICE Course.
 - There is no restrictions to how many AICE courses you can take each year, just keep in mind their difficulty level. (You don't want to stress yourself)

Being in the Cambridge Program you still have to meet the State of Florida Diploma Requirements (All classes that you take above, slide right into those requirements)

- If you are in the Cambridge Program you **DO NOT** have to meet the following on the Diploma Requirements:
 - No Online Credit
 - No PE Credit
 - No Fine Art Credit
