## 24 Credits:

- 4 English credits
- 4 Math credits (Algebra 1 and Geometry)
- 3 Science credits (Biology)
- 3 Social Studies credits
- 2 World Languages credits
- 8 additional courses

(Must complete the CIE AICE Curriculum 7 classes)

**Minimum 2.0 GPA**





# FLDOE AICE Exemptions



Cambridge students are exempt from the following standard diploma graduation requirements:

- Online Course
- Economics with Financial Literacy
- U.S. Government
- Fine Arts
- Health Opportunities through Physical Education (HOPE)

Students must pass the following statewide assessments:

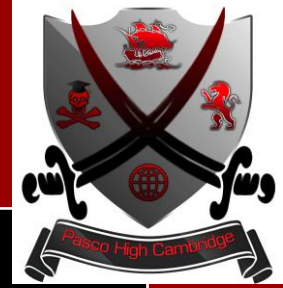
- Grade 10 ELA (or ACT/SAT concordant score)
- Algebra I end-of-course (EOC)

Students must participate in the EOC assessments and the results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade. These assessments are in the following subjects:

- Biology I
- Geometry

English	Pre-AICE English Language/General Paper
Math	Circle one: Honors Algebra 1 (if you took Pre-Algebra in 8 <sup>th</sup> Grade) <u>or</u> Pre-AICE Math 2 (if you took Algebra 1 in 8 <sup>th</sup> Grade) <u>or</u> Pre-AICE Math 3 (if you took Geometry in 8 <sup>th</sup> Grade)
Science	Pre-AICE Biology/Biology Honors/optional freshman year
Social Studies	Pre-AICE World History/Optional freshman year
Electives (Foreign Language if not already taken)	2 Electives of your choice

# Cambridge AICE Advanced International Certificate of Education



*The Cambridge AICE Diploma is a certificate for Cambridge students who pass examinations in subjects drawn from across the curriculum. It offers learners the opportunity to tailor their studies to their individual interests, abilities and future plans within an international curriculum framework.*

required for diploma**

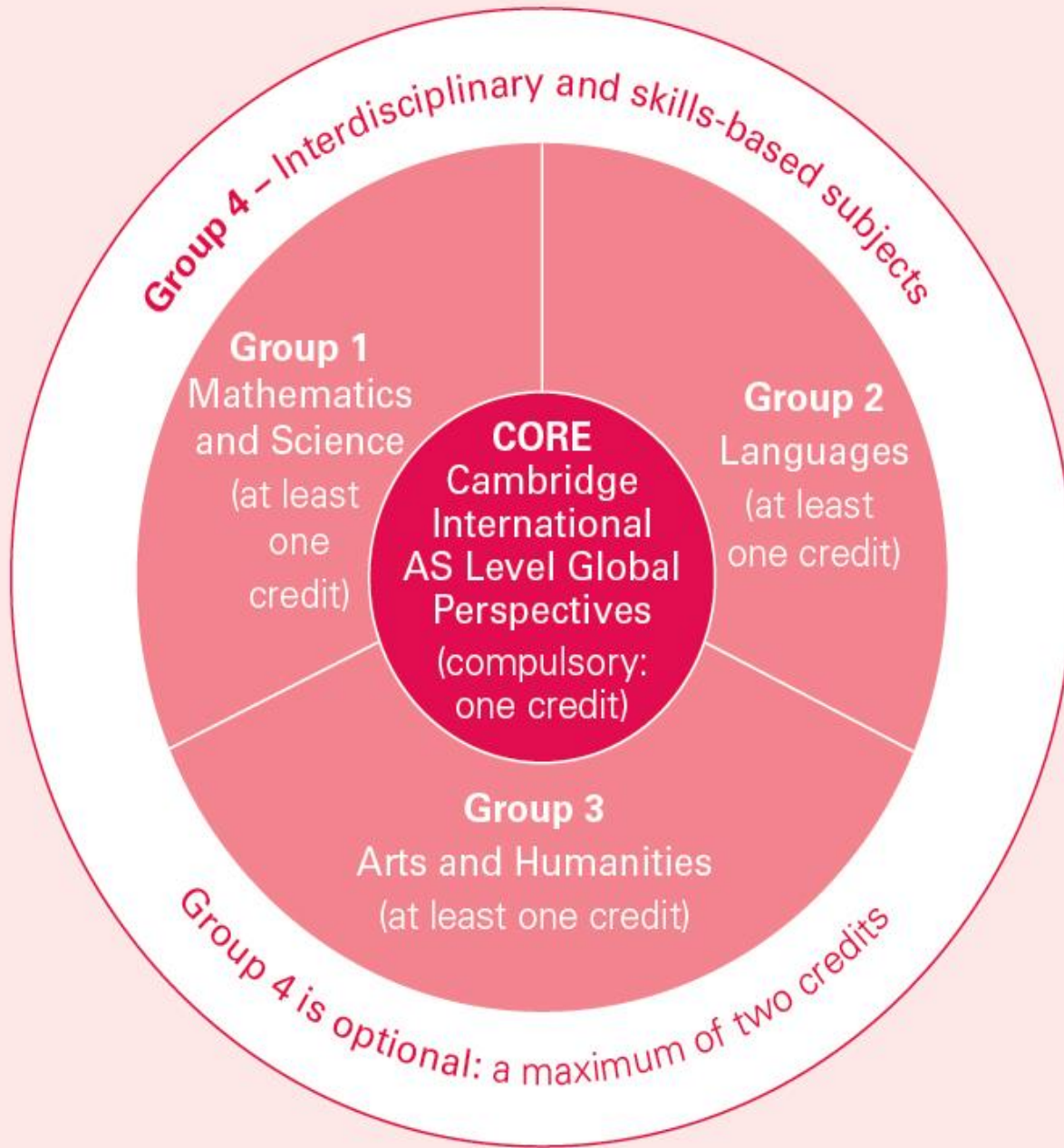


Cambridge International

Cambridge AICE Diploma - Seven credits must be earned to receive a diploma. Students must earn a credit in *Global Perspectives* and at least one credit in each of the groups listed below in red.



- *Group 1: Mathematics and Sciences*
- *Group 2: Languages*
- *Group 3: Arts and Humanities*
- *Group 4: Interdisciplinary and skills-based subjects (maximum of two credits)*

Students may select their remaining three credits from any of the four groups to round out their diploma experience.

# Bright Futures Scholarship



Under the AICE Diploma there are 2 options for earning Bright Futures:

Option 1: Students who **earn the CIE AICE diploma** and **complete 100 hours of community service** will be awarded the Florida Academic Scholars scholarship.

*\*These students are exempt from meeting the GPA and SAT/ACT Requirements.*

Option 2: For students that do not earn the CIE AICE Diploma but **complete the AICE Curriculum:**

Florida Academic Scholars:

- 1290 SAT or 29 ACT
- 100 hours Community Service

Florida Medallion Scholars:

- 1170 SAT or 26 ACT
- 75 Hours of Community Service

*\*Students who meet these requirements are exempt from meeting the GPA requirement.*
